granny stripe

material quick look

- ANY YARN
- RECOMMENDED HOOK SIZE
- Scissors
- BLUNT NEEDLE

gauge No gauge required for this stitch

So what happens when you want the simplicity of a granny square but do not want to make a square? Why you turn that granny square stitch into a stripe. A stripe? Yep, a stripe.

This stitch is the same as a granny square stitch except this one is done back and forth instead of around the beginning circle. It is a simple stitch that can be something used to make a blanket, scarf, or any project you want to make back and forth.

Pattern

To start: Chain a multiple of 3 plus 2 extra stitches **Row 1:** SC in the second chain from hook then SC in every stitch across.

Row 2: CH 2, TURN, 1 DC IN THE SAME STITCH, *SKIP 2 SC, 3 DC IN THE NEXT ST* REPEAT TO THE LAST SC, 2 DC IN THE LAST SC OF THE ROW

Row 3: CH 2, turn, 3 DC in the nearest space between 3 DC cluster, *3 DC in each space between cluster* repeat to the last cluster stitch, 2 dc in the last st (top stitch of the last turning chain)

Row 4: CH 2, TURN, 1 DC IN THE SAME STITCH, *3DC IN EACH SPACE BETWEEN THE CLUSTERS* REPEAT TO THE LAST CLUSTER STITCH, 2 DC IN THE LAST ST OF THE ROW

REPEAT ROWS 3 AND 4 UNTIL DESIRED SIZE.

Row 5: CH 1, TURN, SC IN EACH ST ACROSS, FINISH OFF
